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School Improvement Planning 2023/24

This year we have 3 school improvement priorities

Our priorities for 2023/24 are -

Literacy - Develop a positive Reading ethos and culture across the school.

- Review and self evaluate our reading culture with parents, pupils and staff.
- Analyse our reading data across the school
- Audit our reading materials in class and in the library and purchase as necessary
- Plan a timetable of reading events in the school for pupils and parents to promote reading for enjoyment
- Work closely with other agencies to plan events to raise the profile of reading.

Maths and Numeracy – Build staff confidence and skills in the Developing Number Knowledge/enquiry based Approach

- Staff attend the maths enquiry training
- Staff attend Developing Number Knowledge training
- Look at maths and numeracy planning
- Review and monitor the impact of these across the school
- Plan and hold a session for parents to attend about Developing Number

Framework for Inclusion – Use elements of the Authority Framework for Inclusion approach to meet our context and needs

- Some staff to attend the Framework for Inclusion Conference and share key messages back with the staff
- Complete Inclusive Practice Reflection in school
- Take part in 3 days Nurture training and cascade key areas to staff.
- Nurture training session for all staff
- Teachers complete Respect me online training
- Share work with pupils and parents as part of UNCRC
- Work towards the Silver Rights Respecting School Award
- As appropriate create a framework for inclusion for the school taking into account our context.
- Identify Training needs for staff
