**CAB Assessments** 

It is important that you know how your child is getting on at school. Your child's teacher will use a range of ways to assess your child and to tell you how they are progressing. As part of this we will be using **CAB** Assessments in all primary schools in Dumfries and Galloway.

CAB Assessments are

- Computerised
- Adaptive
- **B**enchmarked


#### What does CAB assessment involve?


As the name suggests, children complete these exercises at the computer. Children wear headphones so that they can listen carefully to instructions and follow the on-screen prompts.

The exercises last no longer than 30 minutes each and are carried out during normal class time to fit in around your child's day-to-day learning.

These exercises take a different approach to assessment as they are *adaptive* – they treat every child as an individual by choosing the difficulty of each question

depending on how well they have answered previous questions. They are not formal tests and are not designed to compare pupils with each other.





Assessments are carried out throughout the year for different year groups.

- · P1 in September
- P3 in October/November
- P5 in October/November
- P7 in February

#### What does the CAB assessment tell us?

CAB Assessments provide information about your child's strengths and what they need to do next. This adds to the other information gathered by your child's teacher in different ways throughout the year to build a picture of how well your child is doing.

The exercises focus on Reading and General Maths as good progress in these areas is key to helping your child make progress generally.

- Reading looks at your child's ability to recognise words, to break them into sounds and to choose the appropriate words to complete a passage.
- General Maths will present questions from several topics such as number work, shape, measuring and reading graphs and charts.
