and baguettes! Yum!






## The Roman Play by P3

Mrs Howie and Mr Henry have been involved closely with 'Graham,' the design team and have been given the opportunity to visit a range of other schools including campuses in the Manchester and Liverpool areas; this has greatly informed the vision for a future learning campus in Dalbeattie, which will provide facilities effective for delivering exciting and innovative ways to deliver collaborative and cross curricular learning.

Over 700 people looked at the new school plans, which were on display at both the Primary and Secondary School on the 3<sup>rd</sup> of April. While there is still some work to be done on finalising the detail of the internal layout of accommodation, there was generally great excitement at the visuals on display. We look forward to watching the next few weeks to see how the plans develop further and how plans for a vibrant outdoor area take shape.
