# **Reporting to Parents**

Meetings with teachers will be held in the hall and allow you to discuss current progress and next steps for your child. No formal report will be issued at this time but a note of targets discussed at the meetings will be shared. Please watch out on Friday for your invitation.

# School Improvement Planning Updates/Staff training

- Staff are currently auditing our reading resources in order to order any gaps.
- This month all teaching staff will be attending a 'Exploring Excellence, Equality and Equity' workshop led by Education Scotland. The training offers staff opportunities to reflect on their values, beliefs and assumptions and to identify any changes we may need to address as a school to help us achieve provide excellence and equity for all learners.
- Mrs Alexander attended a two day training course on Learning with Care, with a focus on promoting an ethos of nurture and wellbeing in schools.
- Mrs Bell and Mrs Menzies attended the Scottish Learning Festival last month looking at literacy developments.
- The Scottish National Standardised Assessments (SNSA) are now available to schools and local

authorities. Over 1000 have already been taken and school staff are currently undergoing training. The main purpose of the assessments is to provide information for teachers on how well children are doing in literacy and numeracy and to help guide learning and teaching. assessments are also designed to produce national-level information about children and people's progress Scottish young for Government. The national information covers the whole of Scotland. To ensure national-level information is as useful as possible, Scottish Government need to carry out a "norming study" to ensure that it is representative of Scotland as a whole. A norming study involves a random sample of Scottish children and young people in Primary 1, Primary 4, Primary 7 and Secondary 3 taking the assessments within a specified period. Two norming studies will be conducted in the 2017-18 school year: one in November and one in March. Parents of pupils who have been randomly selected by the Scottish Government to take part in this study will be notified this week and Mr Palmer will be carrying out the assessments on behalf of the school.

May we once again remind those who are entitled to free school meals and a clothing grant to apply as the Pupil Equity Funding is based on the uptake of those claiming the FSM entitlement. To claim this, you must be in receipt of just *one* of the following:

• Income Support

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- Any income related element of Employment & Support Allowance
- Job Seeker's Allowance (Income Based)
- Child Tax Credit, but not Working Tax Credit, with an income of less than £16,105
- Child Tax Credit and Working Tax Credit (with annual income under £6420)
- Universal Credit with a monthly income threshold that does not exceed £610 per month


