#### **Reporting to Parents**

#### **P5-7- Residential Trips**

Staff and parent volunteers are involved in organising and running school trips that involve staying over. At Hecklegirth we offer outdoor learning experiences that promote an understanding

of environment, inclusion and collaboration. Costs are kept to a minimum through fund-raising and negotiations!

- P5 are heading to Carlingwark in Castle Douglas next week to take part in a range of water sports (weather permitting) and will be accompanied by Mr Malin, Mrs Alexander, Mr Scott (parent volunteer) and PC Leggett. The P5 pupils will be divided into two groups and each group will attend for two days and one night, either Mon/Tues or Thurs/Fri. Trained leaders will be running all the events and equipment will be provided. Trained first aiders will be in attendance at all times.
- P6 and P7 leave for Winmarleigh near Preston on 8<sup>th</sup> May for four days and will be taking part in a variety of outdoor activities including zip wire, den building and climbing. The emphasis is on 'challenge by choice' where pupils will be encouraged to set goals and to give things a go. Pupils will be accompanied on this trip by Miss Dennis, Mrs Stott and Mr Coupland (parent volunteer). Again, skilled leaders will be running the events and trained first aiders will be in attendance at all times. Families enjoyed an informative evening at the end of term where they watched a video about the resort and received an information pack as well as being able to ask any questions about the trips. May we remind you that pupils' mobile phones are not allowed on this trip as explained at the meeting.

These trips take a great deal of organisation and we are most grateful to those who take the pupils away for committing their own time to offer these excellent learning opportunities as well as round-the-clock supervision whilst away from home. In case of emergency we provide a school contact number to call during the time away and we will forward any information required.

Some parents have enquired about planning a trip to London. As teachers plan and lead excursions, we discussed this at a staff meeting and it was felt that this would not be viable for a number of reasons including cost implications for families, concern over safe travel in the Capital, cost of staff cover while staff away for pupils who do not participate, adhering to teaching staff's 35 Hour Working Time Agreement and staff's own family/personal commitments during a period away from home. These are not complaints, just

considerations which can often be overlooked. If you have ideas for school excursions and/or grants to support travel costs then please let us know. As always we continue to seek parent volunteers to accompany classes on trips.

New playground equipment has been purchased and the Learning Council have been out in the playground this week sharing these with the rest of the pupils. May we remind all pupils to look after the new toys and return them to the back door.

School will also be able to support the cost of school clubs and trips during this period so please call to discuss further with Mrs Alexander. All information shared will be handled in the strictest of confidence.

## Entitlement to free school meals/clothing grantsplease read and help us help you!

Pupil Equity Funding is an allocation of money to help reduce the poverty and attainment gap across Scotland, ensuring that we are supporting all our young people to achieve their goals. This allocation is based on those in receipt of the grant. As pupils in P1-3 receive free meals already, many families who are entitled do not request the grant which also allows access to a clothing grant. Only by all those entitled to applying doing so is the school able to receive the maximum benefit so please check below to see if your family can claim.

To claim, you must be in receipt of just *one* of the following:

- Income Support
- Any income related element of Employment & Support Allowance
- Job Seeker's Allowance (Income Based)
- Child Tax Credit, but not Working Tax Credit, with an income of less than £16,105
- Child Tax Credit and Working Tax Credit (with annual income under £6420)
- Universal Credit with a monthly income threshold that does not exceed £610 per month
