### School Improvement Planning Updates/Staff training

- -Some staff are currently out of class for part of the day on a Thursday to work on a small test of change in relation to closing the attainment and poverty gaps. Classes are being covered by Mr Dewar-Riddick and Mr McCall. Projects include a talking, listening & questioning project, focus on phonics, pace of recalling number bonds and nurturing approaches.
- -Mrs Alexander and Miss Tulloch attended an engineering twilight session as part of the region's focus on STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths education).
- Mr Malin and Miss Tulloch continue with their traineeship and recently undertook training on interview skills.
- The school has purchased the Charanga music program which Mr Dewar-Riddick will demonstrate to teaching staff during INSET.
- -The Nursery have begun reading sessions with families to promote reading enjoyment.

### Developing resilience in our young people-

### promoting positive behaviours

Using our Pupil Equity Funding (PEF) we will be trialling a small test of change with P3/4 and P4/5, training staff and pupils in a positive and motivational approach to help them feel more content and confident from the inside out.

Pupils will work with Colette McQueen from Bespoke Minds in class on 9<sup>th</sup> February. This will be followed up by the teachers leading practise sessions for 21 days, using techniques learned in the workshop. A review of the progress will be made at the end to help us measure the impact of the project. If it successful we will be rolling it out to some other classes.

This is just one approach we are using in school to promote positive behaviour and create a safe and positive learning environment for all. Other solutions we are using include the use of praise and encouragement, stickers and certificates to recognise success, staff training on de-escalation skills and developing a nurturing approach, extra support in the playground contact with home, behaviour charts and a successful whole school traffic light system. In some cases we also employ additional staff to deliver an enhanced curriculum through 1:1 sessions outwith the classroom enabling all learners to achieve their goals without disruption, advice from the Inclusion team on behaviour support, the development of a child plan to support individual needs in partnership with other agencies, as well as adaptations to the school day to support inclusion. We are currently reviewing our school policy on Behaviour and request any parents/carers interested in becoming involved in the review to get in touch with the Headteacher.

#### **Water Bottles**

We encourage all our pupils to keep hydrated throughout the day but are quickly running out of polystyrene cups which are not good for the planet! Please remind your child to bring a water bottle to school each day to keep him/her hydrated. We have some for sale in the school office for £1.

### **Entitlement to free school meals/clothing grants**

Are you entitled to free school meals and a clothing grant? If you are, you can claim financial support and help the school claim Pupil Equity Funding. To claim this, you must be in receipt of just *one* of the following:

- Income Support
- Any income related element of Employment & Support Allowance
- Job Seeker's Allowance (Income Based)
- Child Tax Credit, but not Working Tax Credit, with an income of less than £16,105
- Child Tax Credit and Working Tax Credit (with annual income under £6420)
- Universal Credit with a monthly income threshold that does not exceed £610 per month


### **Nursery News from Mrs Carruthers & Mr Palmer**
