Reporting to Parents

School Improvement Planning Updates

- -Our school improvement plan contains developments for the new session. These have been identified through feedback from parents/carers, pupils and staff as well as from guidance at local and national level:
- 1. To develop a whole school nurture approach to improve children's health and wellbeing
- 2. To raise attainment in literacy and numeracy with through increased use of digital technologies and parental engagement
- 3. To improve learning and teaching of Science, Technology, Engineering and Maths (STEM)

Staff training

- -During INSET, all staff undertook Nurture training as the first step in our whole school approach.
- -Teaching staff joined cluster colleagues for a full day of writing skills using Pie Corbett materials. All classes are trialling the story mountain approach to encourage reading and talking as a first step in writing this term.
- -Nursery and P1 staff worked alongside the Occupational Therapist for a session on pre-writing skills which will prove useful in the early years.
- Staff will be offered Lego Therapy training this term.

What is my child learning in school?

Please join us in your child's classroom on Tuesday 4th September from 3-3.45pm where teachers will be sharing information about class learning and homework. This is an informal event to facilitate an introduction to the class teacher and to enable parents of more than one child to move between rooms. We do hope you can make it.

Pupil Equity Funding

The school has received funding to support equality and equity and this is linked to the Free School Meal allocation. Contracts are in place to provide Talking, Listening and Questioning sessions in P1 as well as additional Support for Learning groups across school. We have also identified resources in outdoor learning, literacy and ICT which we will help learners from all backgrounds to access the curriculum fully. We will also use the funding to support attendance at school trips and events which would normally be outwith the reach of some. Suggestions of different ways in which we can use some of our funds to provide equity across school can be shared with the Parent Council or Headteacher.

Events for parents

A basic First Aid training session for parents in school has been arranged in school on Wednesday 12th September from 6-8pm. This is for adults only and will cost £4.50 per head. Please call the school office to book your space.

Allergies
