#### What a Wastell

We have been talking to our pupils about looking after school equipment as we are losing pencils, rubbers and sharpeners at an astonishing rate. With lids not being replaced on glue sticks, felt pens and board markers we are having to throw out dried up wasted resources.

#### Why is it important for pupils to look after equipment?

Interrupts learning and teaching - if a pupil spends 5 minutes three times a day looking for a pencil - that's 15 minutes a day and an unacceptable 1 hour and 15 minutes of learning time lost each week!

Taking responsibility - if pupils learn to take responsibility for small items such as pencils and rubbers then it builds skills for looking after their property later in life.

**Cost** - at a time when money is tighter for everyone we cannot afford to be wasting money replacing equipment which could be looked after better.

#### What can we do?

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Staff have been asked to be vigilant and to insist that pupils replace items and lids. Nagging may be necessary in some cases!

Pupils have been recommended to bring their own pencils. Although it is worth noting that some pupils are reluctant to do this as their pencils can go missing too.

Miss Dale will be leading an assembly on waste of resources to highlight the issue with pupils.

Ask pupils to use pocket money to buy pencils if they lose a school pencil???

Sign out equipment and return it???

Ask pupils to return school property? Return to the school mailbag box - no guestions asked!!

Ask pupils to make up for lost learning time at break time or lunch time???

We would ask that you talk to your children about looking after property – even the small stuff as it can have a big impact on a school day.

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Please get in touch if you have a suggestion on reducing equipment waste in school.

#### <u>SNOW</u>


Thank you to the parents who gave feedback on the recent snowy day. As you know we try
