School Improvement

Some of the main focus areas for this year's school improvement development are:

Raising Attainment - Reading for comprehension. Ensuring that pupils have a deeper understanding of what they are reading / understanding the author's ideas and choice of language. Transferring these skills to all reading.

Developing Growth Mindsets - introducing strategies to support and engage pupils to take their learning forward.

Leadership at All Levels - Miss Stapleton will be undertaking the Introduction to Leadership Course this session and will lead an improvement project for staff.

RAFA - Miss Sarahs will be undertaking a RAFA small test of change project. More details to follow.

Employability Skills - continuing to develop business groups. Inviting parents into school to share their work history and skills with pupils. Connecting with local and national companies to widen pupil understanding and ambition. Career event to share and extend pupil learning.

Family Learning

A very important part of learning for our pupils is the support and involvement of their parents/ carers in the learning process.

In the new How Good is Our School 4 document from Education Scotland it is deemed one of the Quality Indicators to impact on positive progress for pupil learning.

What does this mean at Holywood this session?

Pupils will continue to set and then share targets in learning conversations with their parents.

Homework and homework clubs will have a skills focus and interactive element that parents can get fully involved in.

Parents will be invited to come into school to support learning through Business Groups (Thursdays from 2PM).

Parents will be involved in developing the employability skills of pupils by sharing their experiences.

Celebrations of learning and whole school events will be organised to share learning and to bring the parent community together.

Please note: we will always try to take account of working hours and families with very young children by offering different events at different times or by giving as much notice as possible (through the school calendar) to try to engage as many families as possible.

All pupils have asked us to set technology challenge homework. They will have a month to work on the challenge at home with you before bringing it into school on test day. The aim is for pupils to get inventive and creative - bringing in a wide variety of products and discussing their design process.
