Connecting Classrooms – Mrs Shnapp has succeeded in securing us funding for a second round of visits with our Kenyan partners at Obugi School. It is hoped that two teachers from the school will be at Holywood in May this year. The aim of the visit is for staff to teach our pupils and to observe and discuss learning and teaching here in Scotland.

We hope to encourage Mr Jacob Arodi the head teacher at Obugi school to send two members of his staff team who have worked hard to build the link, like Mr Steve who e-mails regularly and is teaching Obugi pupils to e-mail too.

The funding will meet the cost of air travel but very little else – Miss Dale will be hosting our visitors at her house and would be delighted if any members of the school community would like to invite our visitors to dine with them at home. A unique Scottish experience!

The visit is reciprocal and this means that two members of our school community will be travelling to Kenya in October. To reduce the impact on pupils here at Holywood the trip to Kenya will mainly fall in the school holidays in October.

A number of schools in Dumfries and Galloway are involved in partnerships with Kenyan schools and we have decided to work together to fundraise for the visits. We are currently trying to organise bag packing at local supermarkets – we hope members of the Holywood community will turn out to help pack up the shopping with us. More information to follow.

Parent Meetings – thank you for coming along with your children to discuss learning despite numerous date changes, much appreciated. Feedback was very positive and this format will now be adopted more regularly. Thank you to the five parents who returned the questionnaire sent out by the parent council, we have noted your views.
