# **Equity Funding**

The Scottish Government are awarding schools funding to close the attainment gap. Research has shown that poverty is one of the main causes of the gap in learning in Scotland. Ensuring that schools provide all children with high quality learning experiences and equal opportunities is essential. Information on Pupil Equity Fund and the Scottish Attainment Challenge can be found on the Scottish Government Website.

This year the funding has been based on Free School Dinners information from 2014/15 - recent information could not be used as all P1-3 receive free dinners.

Please note that if you are entitled to meals and clothing grants it is always worth applying—we are happy to provide forms and help fill them in—if you need us! Application are confidential—even your children do not need to know if you don't want them to.

Holywood School has been awarded £14,400 - which is around 4 times more than our annual budget!

I have attended a national conference to extend my understanding of how this funding can be used. We are to receive information from the Local Authority on how this funding can be used.

What do you want your child to achieve before they leave this school?
