72 People have been confirmed dead and a further 8 missing last week when the river Thoren burst its banks while flood waters reach a record of 13 feet and made around 300 people homeless.

Charity's are rushing to aid those affected by the disaster and give temporary shelter and food to the people affected.

Here a woman whose name will be kept anonymous for safety reasons described her ordeal: "I was just nipping out to get my shopping when my car stalled," She then told reporters. "I did not know what to do when I noticed water rising into the carpark at an alarming rate. I left my car and got away as fast as possible."

"Luckily there was a nice couple who did not leave me behind when they noticed I could not run as I am 74 years old and that my car did not seem to start."
