Alliteration

What is Alliteration?

Alliteration is the repetition of the same sound or letter at the beginning of each or most of the words in a sentence. The easiest way to use alliteration would be to repeat the starting letter of the words.

Examples of using alliteration with a letter:

- **Anxious** ants **avoid** the anteater's **advances**.
- **Squawking** seagulls **swoop** on sunbathers.
- The wild winds **whisk** to the west.
- **Zany** zebras zigzagged through the zoo.
