Listening

Talking- KiVa

Challenge:

You may want to look up the weather predictions for other places in the UK too. In class we chose Dumfries and two other places in the UK and your weather forecast presentations were fantastic. If you choose to do this remember you must make it clear that you are talking about different places (you could use a map to point this out).

Reading
