

Spanish- 19th of May 2020

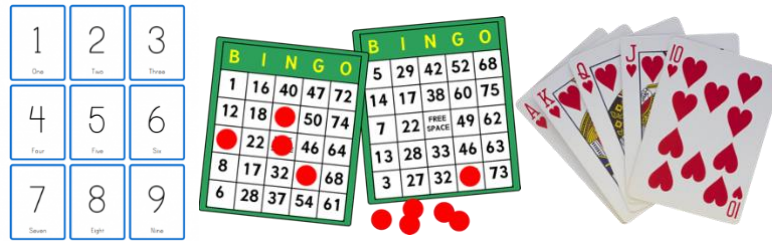


Play some of the games below to work on your Spanish number skills:

Flash cards- make a set of number cards (0-10 or 0-20 depending on how confident you are with the Spanish numbers). Somebody holds up a number card and the fastest family member to call the correct number in Spanish wins the card. Try to collect the most number cards to win the game.

Bingo- draw a 6 square bingo grid, choose your numbers and fill in your grid (start with numbers 0-10 then build up to numbers 0-20). Choose who is going to be the bingo caller for the game. The caller calls out the numbers in Spanish. The first person to mark off all of their numbers is the winner.

Snap- grab a pack of playing cards. Spilt them evenly between the players. If you are the fastest to call the snap, you must then say the number in Spanish to claim the pile of cards. If you don't get the number correct the other player in the game gets a chance to claim the cards in the pile if they get the number correct. The winner is the person who collects all of the cards.
