## <u>Spelling</u>

Test last week's 10 words. Got them all right? Choose another 10.. Couple of errors? Practise those again.

## New activity idea

#### \*Kim's Game

Spelling words are written on cards and laid out on the table. Your child studies the words. They then look away and you remove one of the cards.

They turn back, look at the remaining cards and have 1 minutes (use an egg timer) to write the missing word on a whiteboard.

If they are correct, they win a point, but only if it is spelt correctly!

## <u>Read Aloud</u>

Read a little every day—can you video yourself reading and put it on the blog for us to hear?

#### <u>Reading Tasks</u>

• Quick Reads/Quick Questions

I've posted 4 short reading passages, along with some quick comprehension questions for after they have finished reading. Because the passages are short, encourage your child to practise reading them a couple of times—try and get them to read more fluently each time, and pause at punctuation.

New book cover

Design a new book cover for a book that you have read. Can you think of a good picture for the front cover—the main characters, or maybe an exciting scene? Can you write a short "blurb" for the back—tell us a couple of sentences about the story but don't tell us the ending.

Try to make your sentence longer by adding more information—use **because and so** or **but** to do this.


