Phonics

Reading

- Read the book to someone in your house—look for your common words and use your sounds
- Do the jumbled sentences on page 3

Common Words

Keep practising your child's sight words with them. If they can read words confidently without prompting, move on to the next words. I've put the first 30 on page 4 -but just work on a few at a time!

Scots Language

I've included a link to an e-book called "Jordan's New Jaiket".



Read the story with someone at home, and answer the comprehension questions on page 4 with them—you can talk about them rather than write them down.

Then, can you make a washing line with some of the clothes mentioned in the story, and label them in both Scots and English? Can you find out what other items of clothes are called in Scots and add them to your washing line?

Remember we are looking for: **capital letters, finger spaces, full stops.**

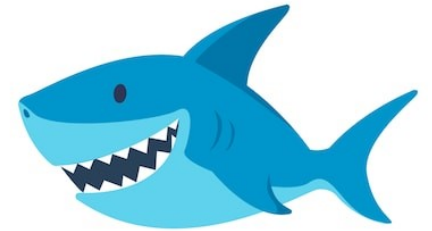
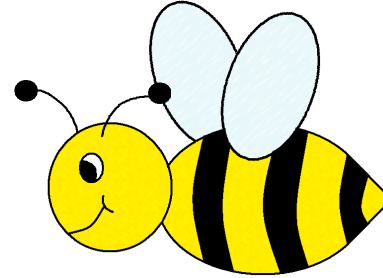
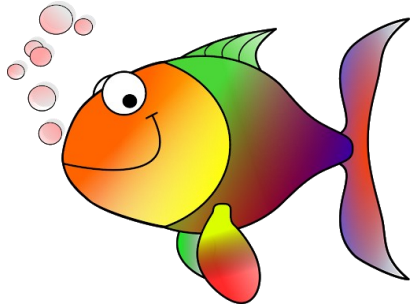
