<u>IDL Polar Bear in the Antarctic Topic – First/Early Level</u>

Week beginning 22.02.21.

Activity 1 - What have you learnt?

Look at these pictures. Print them and cut them out. Stick them on paper and write words and/or sentences to show what you have learnt about these things. (If you can't print them, ask school for a copy, or you could draw them if you like.)









Activity 2 - Survival!

Imagine you are going on an expedition to the Arctic for a week. You are going to travel on foot away from any villages to see what wildlife you can find.

Make a video or write and draw a plan to show what you will need to take – food, clothing, equipment.

<u>Activity 3</u> – Museum Artefacts

Choose a selection of things you might find in the Arctic. Make a mini museum with the objects. You can either use real or home-made artefacts, or photos of the artefacts. (An artefact is just an object that gives us information about a place or person.) Either make a virtual video tour where you explain what each artefact is, or write a short piece of writing to go next to the artefacts in your museum.

Activity 4 - Another place

You know SO MUCH about the Arctic! Now find out about a different part of the world that is different to the Arctic. Tell us in your own way what differences there are between the Arctic and your chosen place. You might like to think about the landscape, weather and what lives there.
