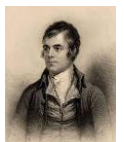
Family Fun Fridays

Children are invited to wear a piece of tartan on this day.

The children are also invited to join Sheuchan's annual Scottish celebrations detailed below:

Burns Poetry Competition - judging will take place during week commencing the 2nd of February should they wish to enter.

Scottish Family Homework - Children are asked to participate in the annual Scottish Family Homework Challenge if they wish. As each child has been asked to learn a Scots poem, we would like them to create a poster/picture/model that represents the theme or title of the poem. Eg. Ma Wee Hoosie, they may create a model of their 'Hoose'. Entries should be handed in prior to the 2nd of February.

Ceilidh, Wednesday 4th February 6.30pm to 8pm- Primary 6 are busy organising the very popular Sheuchan Ceilidh for all the school community. They are keen that this event is well attended so please come along and support them. This event is lots of fun, all the children have been learning Scottish dances, and the ceilidh allows them to share their expertise with family and friends. Entry will be £1 per person and is payable at the door on the night. Donations of Scottish fayre eg, shortbread, tablet, pancakes would be greatly appreciated.

Open Afternoon, Friday 6th of February- there will be an open afternoon where parents will be invited in to enjoy listening to the competition winners reciting their poems and all classes including the nursery will perform a Scottish song.

Children are invited to wear something Scottish such as a piece of tartan on Thursday and Friday of this week. Please note no football or rugby tops.

Winter Clothing

As the weather continues to be cold and changeable can we ask that all children come to Nursery with winter warmers such as hats and gloves. We spend considerable amount of time learning outdoors in all weathers so this will allow the children to remain warm at all times. Can we ask that all clothing is named. As you can imagine it is hard to keep track of all the little gloves and hats!! If your child has been sent home in Nursery clothing for any reason can we ask that you return them as soon as possible? Our 'Spares' drawer is running very low.



Toys and jewellery

Recently we have had an increased number of children arriving at Nursery with toys. As we are unable to allow children to have their own toys in Nursery it causes great upset to have to ask them to put them away in their bag. Please avoid arriving to Nursery with these items. Can we also ask that for health and safety reasons children do not wear necklaces, rings, bracelets and large earrings.

Story Sacks and Numeracy Sacks

Story sacks and Numeracy sacks will continue to be available to take home. These sacks contain books/games or toys which all support Numeracy and Literacy. Sacks can be borrowed for one week at a time and are designed to be shared with an adult, providing some intimate time together. There is no 'wrong' way to use the sacks however some will contain suggested activities. Please use them to encourage your child to be imaginative, have fun and hopefully develop a love of books! These will be located in the Nursery Foyer, please ensure you sign them in and out to allow us to account for all sacks.
