Maths/Numeracy

Number:

P1 ~ Addition and subtraction within 10.

P2 ~ Complete work on numbers to 100, continue addition/ subtraction within 20.

P3/4 ~ Continue addition/subtraction strategies within 100. We will start our Money topic later in the term.

Practical Maths - Measure

P1 ~ Measure in convenient non-standard units e.g. hand span, cubes, language -longer and shorter.

P2 ~ Estimating. Using non-standard units to weigh objects, measure and compare capacities. Introducing the concept and language of area.

P3/4 ~ Estimating and measuring in m, cm & mm. Weighing in kg & $\frac{1}{2}$ kg weights. Measuring and calculating capacity using litres. Measuring area in square centimetres.

Mental Maths

P2/3 follow the "Route 136" scheme (addition/ subtraction/ multiplication) 3x weekly.

We will be learning songs for our upcoming Performance with Mrs Picken later this term.

Health & Wellbeing

Health/wellbeing: learning about different food groups and how they contribute to a healthy diet.

P4 will start a block of swimming in March.

We will continue to participate in our Daily Mile activity within the school grounds, weather permitting.

Talking and Listening

Circle time/News is ongoing, talking about experiences, listening to others & asking questions. The children are involved with topic planning, discussing prior knowledge and what they want to learn. We have weekly Listening Skills tasks.

Weekly personal writing, phonics, grammar, punctuation, comprehension, spelling and dictionary skills are ongoing.
