Interdisciplinary Learning Topic (IDL) Topic: Materials

This term will start with learning our poems to be recited at our Burns afternoon. We will research the meanings of words in Scots that we don't already know in order to learn them and understand the poems and Burns' message in his poems. Our Scottish Afternoon is on **Thursday 23rd January** in Palnackie, for pupils and parents to listen to poems being recited by everyone from P1-7.

From February we will look at Materials and their uses. We will carry out a variety of experiments on light and how it is made up of the seven different colours of the spectrum. Pupils will look at using mirrors to reflect light and show the connection between the angles of light entering and leaving a mirror.
