Interdisciplinary Learning is a planned approach to learning which uses links across different subjects or disciplines to enhance learning. It promotes the development and application of what has been taught and learned in new and different ways. It provides opportunities for deepening learning, for example through exploring an issue, solving problems or completing a final project.

Building the Curriculum 3 (BtC3)

What does it look like in school?

- It may be individual one-off projects or longer courses of study.
- It is planned around clear purposes.
- It is based upon experiences and outcomes drawn from different curriculum areas or subjects within them.
- It ensures progression in skills, knowledge and understanding.
- It can provide opportunities for mixed stage learning which is interest based.




Interdisciplinary Learning
