## Footwear

- Weather appropriate - wellingtons can be worn in winter/wet weather
- Plimsolls for PE \& indoor shoes
- PE outside - trainers

Velcro or slip-on shoes are ideal for younger pupils who cannot tie laces



Presentation
Pupils should be smart and well presented. Jewellery, if worn, should be limited to a watch and sleeper studs - not dangly earrings.

Children should not be wearing make-up.

Long hair should be tied back to help prevent the spread of head lice and for health and safety reasons during practical activities.

## Why do we Wear School Uniforms?

- Helps to promote a positive school ethos
- Helps to reduce peer pressure as clothes can be a status symbol
- Helps to promote a positive school image
- Eases morning routines as everyone knows what they are going to wear
- Helps to identify pupils in the community
- Economic benefit to parents

All Dumfries and Galloway schools must have a dress code which encourages pupils to dress in an appropriate way for attendance at school. This code must not lead to direct or indirect discrimination on the grounds of race, religion, gender, or disability. It is the expectation of Education Services that parents will be supportive of the dress code.

Football emblems/sportswear is not allowed as this could potentially encourage factions.

## What to wear outside -
