Many children attend a variety of clubs after school and fitting in homework can be difficult. Club experiences are beneficial to learning and development.

Takes up most evenings, too much and child not motivated to complete.

Far too much homework - stresses kids out more.

My child doesn't like not doing homework as he worries if it is not done.

Agree with homework during week but weekends are family time.

Don't agree that homework is necessary every week night. Enough work done during school hours. 1-2 times a week would be ideal.

No homework through the week due to other activities –spend time over the weekend when there is more time, not getting rushed.

Homework could be split from week to week – one week maths, one week spelling. Night times are for family time and clubs.

I am worried I may be using the wrong maths techniques.

The way that some maths is taught is different to when I was at school - an understanding would be an advantage.
