Dumfries and Galloway Education Summary of Achievement 2018/19

In Dumfries and Galloway we have:

20,000 3-18 year olds in our **159 Learning Establishments** with about **1500 young people** leaving school each year.

Dumfries and Galloway are working in collaboration with Ayrshire Authorities to improve attainment overall. Staff are in workstreams looking at areas including closing the poverty related attainment gap, increasing teacher confidence, leadership and numeracy

Pupils leaving school are showing an improvement over 3 years for **Literacy** from **92.0%** at level 4 or better to **94.3%**



Education Scotland Inspection of Schools show for **Learning, Teaching and Assessment** **67%** rated good or better **88%** rated satisfactory or better

Secondary Schools are increasingly offering a wider choice of courses for pupils to access allowing **individualised learning**




Pupils leaving school are showing an improvement over 3 years for **Numeracy** from **86.3%** achieving level 4 or better to **90.3%**
