#### **Time Challenge!**

With your eyes shut, can you judge a minute accurately?  
Find a clock or watch with a second hand or use a phone with a timer. When the second hand is at 12, shut your eyes and open them when you think that a minute has elapsed. Do this 3 times. Do you become more accurate?

More challenges – in your jotter see how many times you can do the following in 1 minute.

- Write your name
- Tie your shoe laces
- Bounce a ball
- Stand up and sit down
- Write the alphabet
- Do a star jump

Now on a piece of paper make tally marks for each 'time pieces' there are in your house or different ways to tell the time. Don't forget to look at TV's computers, fitbits, cookers etc.

Remember a tally mark is 4 vertical lines IIII with 1 diagonal line / through them to make 5
