<p><b><u>Maths</u></b></p> <p>This week we are going to concentrate on counting in our maths work.</p> <p>I have set work for you on Education City in your groups. Your username and password on the information sheet inside the front of your green jotter was incorrect and you were sent a new one. You can still use all the other games on Education City but I am looking at these ones this week.</p>	<p><b><u>Triangles</u></b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Log-in to Education City and go on to Classwork. I have put new activities in a Counting folder for your group. If you go on at anytime you can Play Live against children all over the country.</li> <li>2. Count forwards within the range 1-20 stopping and starting at different numbers.</li> <li>3. Have a Number scavenger hunt. Make a list of items to find e.g. 5 leaves, 6 twigs (outdoors) 4 pens, 3 spoons (indoors).</li> </ol>	<p><b><u>Rectangles</u></b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Log-in to Education City and go on to Classwork. I have put new activities in a Counting folder for your group. If you go on at anytime you can Play Live against children all over the country.</li> <li>2. Number knowledge <a href="#">activity 1</a> - The digit 3.</li> <li>3. Number knowledge <a href="#">activity 5</a>.</li> <li>4. Bonds to 10 Roll a dice. What number do you add on to make ten? Write the sums...how many can you find?</li> <li>5. Write down 4 numbers in the range of 1-100. Put the numbers in order from smallest to largest. Choose another 4. Now put them in order from largest to smallest. Try other examples.</li> </ol>	<p><b><u>Circles</u></b></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Log-in to Education City and go on to Classwork. I have put new activities in a Counting folder for your group. If you go on at anytime you can Play Live against children all over the country.</li> <li>2. Number knowledge <a href="#">activity 1</a> - The digit 3 but try to go up to 1000.</li> <li>3. Number knowledge <a href="#">activity 9</a> - Digit Shuffle.</li> <li>4. Blank 100 square - there was one in your home learning pack. Place a counter on a box. What's the number? Cover 3 numbers in a row -down, across, diagonal. What are those numbers? Use a numbered 100 square to help you at first.</li> <li>5. Roll to win! Player 1 rolls 3 dice (or one dice 3 times). Make the biggest number you can using these 3 digits. Player 2 rolls 3 dice -the player with the highest number wins the round. Play for 5 rounds and keep score using tally marks. If you don't have dice at home try this <a href="#">link</a>.</li> </ol>
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
