

<p><u>Maths</u> <u>Numeracy</u></p> <p>Choose 2 bricks from your group's numeracy home learning wall below. These activities will reinforce the practical tasks being taught and covered in class. Choose an activity and if you can, colour and date the brick when covered. You can use your jotter to write down any work or descriptions of what you have done.</p> <p>Circles: 5A Wall Triangles: 3A Wall</p>	<p><u>Maths</u> Sumdog National Contest</p> <p>To take part, simply play Sumdog's maths games. As a reward for taking part, everyone who answers 100 questions will receive an item for their Sumdog House.</p>	<p><u>Maths</u> Rounding Rocket</p> <p>Choose to round a 2-digit or 3-digit number to the nearest 10 or 100.</p> <p>Simplify: Round with the number line. Challenge: Round without the number line.</p> <p>If the ones digit is 1,2,3 or 4, leave the ten just as before. If it's 5,6,7,8 or 9 round up to the next ten on the number line.</p>	<p><u>Maths</u> Jigsaw</p> <p>When you finish your box of cereal, cut it up and turn it into a jigsaw. While creating a fun game for yourself, you are also developing your skills of dividing, measure, design, cutting and recycling.</p> <p>Alternatively, you could cut your box into 2D shapes instead of jigsaw pieces. I look forward to seeing your work.</p>

Click here for login details.</p> <p>Reading Wise group Accelerated reading</p>	<p><u>Language</u></p> <p><u>Spelling</u> Practise your group's spelling words in your jotter following the look, cover, say and check method you are familiar with. Ask an adult to test you at the end of the week. Include the ingredients, equipment and method.</p> <p>Include some of the key features of instructional writing such as chronological order, simple precise language and bossy verbs.</p> <p>Email your finished recipe so that we can create a Primary 4 recipe book.</p>	<p><u>Language</u></p> <p><u>Talking and listening</u></p> <p>These cards can be used for conversation practice and will help develop your social skills. Cut up or read out the cards then take it in turns to pick a card and ask the question. Focus on:</p> <p>Speaking clearly and audibly Taking turns to speak Listening and responding Eye contact, expression and body language</p>
