<p><u>Literacy</u></p> <p><u>Reading – Book Trail</u></p> <p>Use the website "What Should I Read Next?" to make a trail of at least 5 books that you would like to read. Then make it your mission to read all of them over the next few weeks / months.</p> <p>For example: When I type in "The Twits" I get a list of books that I might like underneath. I like the look of "Lunch Money", click on it and a new list is generated.
