Context: 'Nip Nebs/Nip Nebs and the Last Berry' by Susi Briggs - we'd suggest starting with **the story** before accessing other activities 😊

<p><u>Story Time</u> Watch this video of Susi Briggs telling her story 'Nip Nebs' and the follow-up 'The Last Berry'. These are written in Scots language - ask someone at home what the different Scots words mean. Follow along if you have the book at home.</p>	<p><u>Sounds</u> Try one of these winter letter formation activities: Letter Skate - scroll half way down the page. Letter Ice Painting - make ice paint and use them to write your letters at home. Snow Tray Letters Use the Sound Cards and Actions sheet on the main page to see the sounds we've learned so far. Challenge: make some simple CVC words eg. cat, dog, wet...</p>	<p><u>Numeracy</u> Log into Education City to access the number games your teacher has set up for you. <i>Check your email for details on how to access Education City.</i> Extra practise: Use the Number Formation document on the main page for help with writing your letters and the Ten Town rhymes.</p>	<p><u>PE and Movement</u> Use this Cosmic Kids yoga video to keep moving - join Joybob the polar bear in this wintery story.</p>	<p><u>Art and Craft</u> In our story, Nip Nebs appears in the cold, wintery weather. Design yourself a new winter hat to keep you cosy. You may wish to use the template on the main page or draw your own. Challenge: can you add patterns into your design?</p>
<p><u>Wellbeing</u> Going outside and getting fresh air is great for your body and mind. Why not go on a wintery walk with your family. Can you see any ice or frost? Feel free to take pictures of what you see and send them via the class email.</p>	<p><u>Outdoor Learning</u> Why not make a simple bird feeder for the birds in your garden or at the local park? The birds need our help to find food in this cold weather. Use this website to help you.</p>	<p><u>Finding Information</u> After making and hanging your bird feeder, why not use 'My First Book of Birds' from the Bookbug Bag to help you identify the birds in your local area. What birds do you see and what have you learned about</p>	<p><u>Make and Create</u> Playdough: use this simple playdough recipe to make some snow dough. Use food colouring if you'd like, or a small amount of glitter if you have it at home to make it sparkle. Store in a ziplock bag to keep it fresh.
