IDL - Emotion Works

We have learned about the different "cogs" which helped us to identify the reasons for our behaviour, the choices we make while experiencing a feeling and how our body tells us we are experiencing an emotion. These were "triggers", "body sensations", "emotion words" and "behaviours".

Could you make a comic strip to show these? For example, your character might get knocked over during a game of tig (trigger), hurt their knee and start crying (body sensations), feel upset and angry (emotion words), take a walk with their friend until they feel better and finally talk to the person who hurt them to see if it was just an accident (behaviour).
