Create your own spelling activity. What fun way can you come up with to help you remember your words? **Show** me how you'd do it...




Waterfall Words

Dictionary Definition

Look-up your words in a dictionary and write down the **definition**. You can use *paper* or *online* dictionaries.

Spelling Sums

Calculate the value of each word. Vowels = 5, Consonants = 2

- spider: 2+2+5+2+5+2 = 18 or using tables...
 - $4 \times 2 = 8$
 - $2 \times 5 = 10$
 - 8 + 10 = 18

Tricky Twenty

Take a check-up on past spelling words. Ask someone to flick back through your jotter and pick out 20 **tricky** words. **Write** them down like we do on Friday. How many did you still spell correctly? Give yourself a score out of 20.



Quick Questions

Use your spelling words to **write** questions. Remember a question mark. You might need some good question openers:

Who... Where...

What... Why...

When... How...
