

Literacy-Writing

Think about any New Years Resolutions you might have for the year.

Think about targets you can set for school **and** for home.

Write about **what** you want to achieve, **why** you want to achieve it and **how** you are going to achieve it.

Try to write **at least 2** targets for school this year, for example, learning times tables, trying to write more, listening in class.

Try to write **at least 2** targets for home, for example, keeping your room tidy, help doing the dishes, or a target for a club you attend.

Remember to use **VCOP** in your writing and to write in full sentences!

Literacy-Reading

Read any books that you have at home. Let me know what you are reading and if you are enjoying it!

Read the passage about New Year and how it is celebrated in the UK. Try to answer the question sheet after you have read it. There are 3 levels of difficulty for this (like a chilli challenge) pick which level you think is best for you 1, 2 or 3. Remember to try and challenge yourself! In Teams go to **Literacy>Files>Reading>New Year Reading**.

This term you would normally be learning a Scots poem as part of the Burns competition in school. I would still like you to learn the poem even though we won't be in school.

Primary 4 your poem is [The Puddock](#) by John M. Caie.

Primary 5 your poem is [A Dug A Dug](#) by Bill Keys.

Try to learn your poem over the next 3 weeks if you can. You can also search for them on Youtube to hear others reciting them to help you with this.

Literacy-Spelling

Log in to SUMDOG and practice your spelling words for the week.

On Thursday a spelling test will become available until Sunday for you to complete.

The pages from your spelling textbook will also be on Teams along with some ideas of how you can practice your spelling words. In Teams go to **Literacy>Files>Spelling** and then your spelling group folder.

Write 5 sentences using your new spelling words.



Maths

We are going to be learning about money this term.

Can you name all the coins and notes we use in the UK without looking it up? What is our currency?

Write or draw them in order from smallest amount to biggest amount. Is there any money at home that you could use to help you with this?

Do the Money activities set on Education City and try to complete these [Education City](#) worksheets about money.

I have set you a SumDog challenge to complete called 'Money Challenge'. See how you get on with this!

There is also a SumDog Dumfries and Galloway contest starting on the 15th January. See how high you can get up the leader board!

Maths

Choose times tables you need to practice. Write the questions out

e.g. $1 \times 7 =$ $2 \times 7 =$ $3 \times 7 =$ etc

and then write the answers out on separate pieces of paper.

Play a pairs memory game with someone in your family or try to match them on your own.
