

Numeracy - Money Revision for All

Last term our target was to learn all coins to £2. Can you find each of the following coins and tell an adult what each one is? 1p 2p 5p 10p 20p 50p £1 £2

Can you lay them out in order from smallest to largest value? How many 1p's are in 5p? How many 5p's are in 10p? How can you make 3p? Can you make a rubbing or draw round each coin and label it?

Do you have a piggy bank? Can you count how much money you have with an adult?

Primary 1: can you work out how many different ways to make 5p using 1p, 2p and 5p coins.

Primary 2: can you work out how many different ways to make 10p and 20p using 1p, 2p, 5p, 10p and 20p coins.

Literacy: Reading-ongoing every week (more info in email)

All: Please practise your reading words daily.

For word sheets, please open up emails for more detailed instructions and you will find the word lists are attached in case the ones which were sent home have been lost. The email will be titled either 'Biff' or 'Chip' or 'Kipper' or 'Floppy' Reading Words. The email will have been sent by Mrs Howie. Word Walls can also be practised daily as sight reading (in addition to being used for spelling- see next box)

Primary 1 can also practise their WordBox lists (1, 2 etc) words which focus on blending skills using phonic knowledge. These have also been attached to the Primary 1 email about reading words. (Primary 1 will have reading texts on next week's grid) **Primary 2** also have reading texts to read on Oxford Owl. This is also explained in same reading email.

Ask an adult to draw some lines on a piece of paper for you. You could ask an adult to write your letter and leave a line for you to copy underneath like we do in school. I hope you remember your neat writing, finger spaces, capital letters and full stops. Remember to think about your sentence carefully and include all the words you need.

Outdoor Learning

As the season at the moment is WINTER, go for a walk each day. Use one letter each time and try to make a list of things you can see with that letter. e.g the first letter is W, you might see windows, wire or a wall. How many things can you see for each letter? Keep a note of what you see and maybe you could make a poster for each letter. Write the letter in the middle of the page and then draw the things you saw around the letter. How could you make the letter 'W' look wintery?
