3. Use your tables knowledge to find a fraction of a number! E.g. $6 \times 3 = 18$ so $18 \div 3 = 6$. Remember last week, to find a $\frac{1}{5}$ of a number you divided it by 5. This week there are a mixture of sums. Finding a $\frac{1}{3}$ by dividing by 3 and a $\frac{1}{4}$ by dividing by 4 or halving the number twice.

Literacy – Spelling

1. Read and discuss the meaning of each word.
2. Look carefully at the whole word before you spell. Hide the word then try to spell it. Next check if it is correct. If it is wrong then repeat.
3. Play different games up to 3 x 20 mins. per week to memorise(so it goes into your long term memory) the spelling e.g. wet your finger and write the word on a table /worktop, sprinkle flour on a clean dry surface to write your words in, noughts and crosses,
4. **Spelling task on Sumdog**
4. Write 3 **interesting** sentences using some of your words.
5. **Dictation**

Don't let your child learn the dictation sentences because they are to check if they have learned the spelling rule and can apply it to similar words. Read each sentence to your child twice, quite quickly, so they focus and write quickly but neatly using punctuation. Then check it with them and revise mistakes.

Circle Art/Maths

Create a picture using circles or semi-circles.

You do not need to do the exact lesson shown in the video. Be creative and make a picture with circles and or semi-circles.

Collect some object(cylinders) e.g. tins & plates so you can draw around their bases. If you do not have coloured paper you could colour your circles. Why not recycle cereal boxes or other packets to draw your circles on. Use the coloured side in your picture. You could draw around your shapes in felt tip then wet it to let the colours bleed. Like the skulls in your art lesson at school.
