**P.E.**

I have been asked to remind everyone that on PE day, we recommend that children do not wear jewellery to school. It is very time consuming having to remove chains and tape up earrings particularly for the younger classes.

We are still also noticing a significant number of children in upper classes not bringing a full change of clothes for after PE lessons. Please make sure your child is provided with a full change of clothes.

Further reminder - football tops or football t-shirts (of any club including local teams) are not permitted to be worn in school or for PE. Please make sure if your child packs their own PE kits that they are not packing football tops to wear.
