- Continue to provide the option of uniforms made with Fairtrade cotton
- Use the Fairtrade Schools Award on our communication, electronically and on paper
- Put this Policy into practice through a Fairtrade Group that meets regularly to:
- Monitor and drive forward the school's support for and learning about Fairtrade
- Make sure all school partners are aware of this Policy and can support it
- Take responsibility for Fairtrade Challenges and the Fairtrade Action Plan
