Rights

All pupils have the right to:

All staff have the right to:

- * Be treated with respect
- * Enjoy working in their learning environment

All parents/carers have the right to:

- * Be fully involved in their child's learning
- * Know that their child is safe and happy in school
- * Participate in positive communication with the school

Responsibilities

All pupils have the responsibility to:

- * Behave in a way that allows others to learn
- * Treat everyone with respect
- * Respect the school rules

All staff have the responsibility to:

- * Promote learning in a stimulating environment
- * Treat pupils fairly and with respect
- * Ensure the safety and wellbeing of all pupils

All parents/carers have the responsibility to:

- * Take an active role in their child's education in school and at home
- * Treat all pupils and staff with respect
- * Respect the school rules and encourage their children to do so
