From August 2024-June 2025 – PTs of Inclusive Practice have delivered 20 Stages of Intervention training sessions at school, cluster and authority level with 460 practitioners. This was 73 ELC staff, 205 primary practitioners, 153 secondary practitioners, 26 learning assistants, 2 Learning centre staff and 1 home link worker. From this training 15 settings were provided with information regarding the initial impact of the training on their confidence.
