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We welcome a number of new staff to school this year. Mrs Dingwall is our new P1 teacher. We have 2 newly qualified teachers, Miss Murray in P2 and Miss Leonard in P6. We welcome back Miss Harkness and Miss Rogerson from their maternity leave. We also welcome Miss Malone to our school office.

Mrs Denman left the QLC over the summer and Miss Duncan is now a full-time permanent teacher in the QLC.

We currently have had issues with staff absence and retention in the QLC and have four Support for Learning Assistant posts advertised with a closing date of 28th August. For pupil safety reasons, we have had to start the school year for QLC pupils on a reduced timetable, this is for pupil safety due to lack of staff training for temporary supply staff. This is not a decision that was taken lightly and we hope to have this remedied as soon as possible.
