Heathhall update on school priorities 2017/2018

School Priority 1:

To raise attainment at
Heathhall school towards the
stretch aim of 85% pupils
achieving literacy and numeracy at the correct level.

- All pupils/staff and parents have worked together to revisit and develop a shared vision. This new statement has been shared and promoted with feedback from pupils/staff and parents very positive.
- Staff have identified pupils through looking at data and also those who fall into the most disadvantaged group. A plan of action, in partnership with parents, Additional Support Teacher and partners(where specific expertise has been recognized as being required), has been carried out and progress for these pupils in the areas where they have been identified has been tracked, evaluated and impact measured. Most pupils have made good progress with these interventions.
- Working with an identified Early Years Partner we have gained an understanding and appreciation of the different contexts in which we work. Engagement and communication is more regular, structured and supportive. This has resulted in a clear strategy in place for growing the partnership with a commitment to improving the outcomes for our leaners who transfer from this provider to Heathhall P1.
- There has been an agreement in the shared process to be used for the transfer of information about all children moving from Heathhall to a secondary school within DLT. Staff in secondary will have curricular and SHANARRI information allowing support and decisions to be made to meet the needs of all children giving each child the best possible start to their secondary education.
- ELC staff have planned for learning and assessment towards benchmarks. Staff have improved confidence in planning for assessment using E&Os/Benchmarks . Staff make more confident judgements about children's progress,
- ELC staff have carried out Talking, Listening and Questioning (TLQ) interventions with an identified group of children with the target of pupils making an improvement of more than 6 months in their communication skills.

School Priority 3:

Sharing the Standard/Moderation Heathhall School have established collaborative approaches to assessment and moderation

- Heathhall School have developed a collaborative approach to ensuring that there is a consistency within and beyond Heathhall to determining an achievement of a level in Literacy/English and Numeracy/Mathematics
- Assessments ,based on moderated activities are consistent for pupils across stages both within Heathhall and DHS cluster in identified curricular areas.
- All staff from Nursery to P4 have engaged with the Developing Number Knowledge approach to deliver Maths at Early and First level.
- Most staff in nursery to P4 are more confident in the delivery of the programme.

School Priority 2:

Our Curriculum
To ensure that all
pupils have their
entitlement to a
broad general education which provides, breadth, challenge and application

- All pupils have engaged with a progressive skills programme in line with new CfE benchmarks for all curricular areas.
- Our structured curriculum provides equity of opportunities to maximise the successes and achievements of all pupils at Heathhall, this ensures that all pupils are achieving a broad general education with appropriate challenge and support to meet pupil need.
- Pupil progress is recorded much more consistently.
- Staff have used new Maths and Literacy planning format to forward plan learning All staff agree that this has had impact on their own professional learning as well providing breadth in delivering the curriculum to pupils.
- All class teachers have developed Inter disciplinary (IDL) plans (to include unique features of the school community as reflected in our rationale) to incorporate skills from across the curriculum (Numeracy, Literacy, Digital Technologies and Health and Wellbeing) This has provided all pupils the opportunity to develop the application of learning across curriculum areas
- Our pupils, in the school and ELC setting, are developing the skills our young people need in the world of work through planned learning experiences which provide increasing levels of challenge.
- Almost all staff have undertaken professional learning and worked collaboratively (Using D&G Pathways to Employability) to develop a progressive planning framework for Skills life and work called 'Heathhall Skills Academy'.
- P7 pupils have engaged with the My World of Work profile.
- In the primary, and ELC all pupils have experienced a broader range of digital technologies within and across the curriculum.
- P6 and P7 pupils through the use of Glow Blogs capture and celebrate their successes and wider achievements.
- All staff take responsibility for delivering digital literacy across the curriculum. Most learners have demonstrated these skills with increasing confidence in a variety of meaningful contexts.
- The sharing of learning through the use of a new Facebook page has increased engagement from pupils and parents.
- Some pupils in the primary and nursery have experienced being a digital leader.

School Priority: 4

To implement the national expectation of a 1+2 language by June 2018

- All pupils have access to a progressive French programme of study from P1 to P7.
- All pupils in P5 to P7 have access to a progressive programme in Spanish
- Through team teaching with specialist's delivery staff continue to improve confidence in the delivery of this area of the curriculum and improve pupil attainment.
