Literacy


During work in Literacy we will be developing reading comprehension skills. The children will be reading a shared class novel. We will focus on comprehension strategies. In written work children will be extending their use of descriptive vocabulary. We will also be focussing on the features of report writing. The children will be given new spelling words each week and these will be practised using a variety of active tasks. The children should also practise these words at home each week. Weekly spelling lists will be issued on Teams every Tuesday. More information on homework will follow.

Other Curricular Areas

Within Digital Literacy we will be looking at the need for secure passwords and being safe on the internet. We will also be making use of Adobe Express through a variety of contexts.

In IDL our focus this term will be lead by the pupils. We have already began some discussions about what they would like to learn this term.

In French we will be revising previous learning and continue building fluency. We will also be learning to count to 100 in French.





Maths and Numeracy

During Numeracy work we will be focusing on Place Value and number systems. We will also be working on addition and subtraction strategies and reinforcing our times table facts.

Within Maths we will be looking at aspects of measure.

We will be continuing with the use of Sumdog both in class and as homework.

Health and Wellbeing (H&WB)

P.E will be on a Monday and Thursday.
Children should bring their PE kit on these days to change in to. Mr Sharp will focus on basketball and Mrs Kirkpatrick will work with the class on possession games.
Our Wellbeing focus this term is 'Respected' where we will look at respecting ourselves and others. In Health and Wellbeing we will discuss the effect that a range of substances including tobacco and alcohol can have on the body.

Zones of Regulation

The whole school has begun using Zones of Regulation as a way to support everyone to understand their emotions. We have discussed a toolkit to help us get to the green zone to help us be ready to learn.

This will be displayed in class.

Homework

We have set up a class Teams page which will be used to issue homework and any reminders for pupils. Homework will be issued each week on a Tuesday and a reminder will be posted on Teams.

- Spelling new spelling lists will be issued on a Tuesday on our class Teams page. These words should be practised at home using suggested activities and children will complete a spelling check in class on a Monday.
 - Numeracy/Maths Numeracy/Maths homework will be set fortnightly. This will alternate between Sumdog and a written task.
 - Reading Children will continue to bring home an Accelerated Reader book or a familiar reading book. A reading grid will be sent home each term and children can choose activities to complete using their book.

More information about homework will be sent home in due course, along with a timetable of what homework will be issued when.
