What will we be learning this term?

An important focus for term 2 will be developing independence throughout the school day and during our learning and play. We will be discussing the skills we use at school and home and continue to learn about our rights. We are looking forward to spending an increased amount of time with other members of our school family and building links with our local community.

Literacy

P1- Hearing and saying the sounds made by different letters * Using sounds to read and write words * Letter formation * Writing a description * Writing a recount of events * Giving and following instructions * Using finger spaces and full stops * Building sentences * Speaking in front of the class to share information *

P2 – Using capital letters and punctuation in writing * Using descriptive language and the 7 perspectives * Phonic sounds in reading and writing * Comprehension of texts including individual reading books * Letter writing * Writing a recount * Instruction writing * Handwriting.

In French we will be learning numbers to 20, colours and weather vocabulary.

Interdisciplinary Learning

Our topic this term will be celebrations.

We will be learning to research and compare the main ideas of stories in the Bible and other world religions, We will consider the Right to follow a religion and the importance of understanding the beliefs and values of others.

The Christmas story will be a focus on the run up to the December holidays.

Children will continue to lead the focus of our IDL topics and record their learning in our Big Book.

We love loose parts!

In P1/2 we love to play and learn with loose parts. If you have any objects we could use to count, build or play please get in touch.

Some examples of loose parts are-

- tubes & pipes
- crates & boxes
 - logs & shells
- kitchen items and many more

Numeracy

When learning maths and numeracy we apply our learning and knowledge to real life situations, hands on activities, play, written tasks and discussions.

P1- *Identifying, sequencing and ordering numbers * Identifying the number before/after and missing numbers *Counting forwards and backwards * Addition and subtraction * Symmetry * Estimation and checking estimates.

P2- Sequencing numbers forwards and backwards to 100 * Partitioning numbers within 100 * Addition and subtraction * Skip counting and number patterns * Doubles and halves *Number bonds to 20 * Odd and even. numbers.
