At school.....EVERY DAY COUNTS!

If you want your child to be successful at school then, YES, attendance does matter

1 or 2 days a week doesn't seem like much but......

If your child misses	That equals	Which is	Over 13 years of school that is
1 day every 2 weeks	20 days per year	4 weeks per year	Nearly 1½ years
1 day per week	40 days per year	8 weeks per year	Over 2½ years
2 days per week	80 days per year	16 weeks per year	Over 5 years
3 days per week	120 days per year	24 weeks per year	Nearly 8 years
