This term, focus will be on learning in Literacy, Numeracy and Health and Wellbeing which may result in changes to the above timetable.

Topic

Our topic this term will be a book study of 'George's Marvellous Medicine' (do not worry if your child knows the story, learning will focus on new skills and knowledge). Topic work will include the following subjects: Literacy, Health and Wellbeing, Art and Design, Technology, Maths and Science. Learning will include such things as:

- Developing a wide range of comprehension skills
- Completing an author study
- Developing skills within formative and personal writing
 - Learning about personal safety
 - Learning to recognise and manage feelings and emotions
- Developing drawing skills such as using line and colour
 - Measurement
- Properties and sources of materials (i.e. liquids, solids, etc.)



Numeracy

Numeracy learning will focus on developing core number skills. This will include:

- Place Value
- Counting
- The 4 number processes (addition, subtraction, division and multiplication).

Maths will link with topic and develop knowledge in measurement and shape.



Reading: Developing technical accuracy when reading and becoming reading detectives

Handwriting: Letter/number accuracy and handwriting joins

Writing: Personal and functional writing linked to our topic

Grammar: This term we will be developing our confidence and ability to create accurate writing consistently (this will include sentence structure, transferring spelling and handwriting skills, using a range of punctuation correctly, etc.). We will also be creating and using a writing checklist.

Spelling: Single Word Spelling

Health and Wellbeing: Health and wellbeing will be a big focus during our initial return to school. We will work on developing our awareness and understanding of emotions (and how we can manage these safely), relationships with others, resilience and hygiene.
