Hygiene: Catch it - Bin it - Kill it



Within the nursery there is an increased awareness of the importance of good hygiene. It is evident that the children are more aware of the importance of washing their hands and that they are more likely to do it correctly. However, we have noticed that when it comes to coughing and sneezing, not all children are doing it correctly. We have been discussing this with the children. If they are going to cough or sneeze they need to Catch it – Bin it – Kill it. Will you please reinforce this at home.

Due to the need of increased ventilation within nursery as the windows and doors need to be kept open, it is advisable the children come to nursery with layers of clothing, so they can easily adapt to the different temperatures. Also please make sure your child wears a suitable outdoor jacket and shoes (preferable wellies) to school every day. As we are outside so much at present it would also be very helpful if you sent your child with a pair of wellies.
