


The school building was opened on 5 October 1981 and comprises four units opening off a central, general-purpose hall. Three of the units have three bases, a wet area and pupil toilets while the fourth houses the administration, medical and staff accommodation plus a general-purpose classroom used primarily for music and drama.

In August 2003 a large children's centre, comprising a nursery, two classrooms and a Learning Centre, with a spa pool, was completed. The nursery can take 100 children and has a secure play area. The Learning Centre has a sensory room and also has access to a secure play area. The school also has community facilities, a family room, an interview room and a community room. The community room has computer access.

The school is surrounded by beautiful rolling countryside ideal for hill walking, mountain biking and fishing. The area is steeped in the history of the Covenanters and there are many cairns and memorials dedicated to them around the area.

Drumlanrig Castle and its grounds are some ten miles to the south and the Lead Mining Museum, at Wanlockhead, is approximately the same distance to the south-east.

The school has strong ties with the local Heritage Society and there has been joint community working on a number of projects such as film making and the regeneration of local walkways.

Coal mining was an important industry in the area and the school remembers this tradition in a variety of ways. With the closure of the mines the area's largest employer is Brown Brothers who have an international reputation for quality meats.

We are part of an Integrated Community School cluster with Sanquhar Academy and Sanquhar Primary with whom we share a Home/School Link Worker and a Family Learning Coordinator.

The school is an Eco-school and we have recently developed our own wildlife garden in a joint project involving staff pupils parents and local volunteers.

We are also aiming for our Investors In People award.

The school was founded by David Jardine, a wealthy Victorian merchant who made his fortune in China and the Far East. He bequeathed £1000 for the education of poor children in Applegarth, his native parish.

In more recent times the school has undergone an extensive refurbishment, and was formally re-opened after this work by Richard Greenhow O.B.E. Chairman of the Education Committee on 8 September 1994.

Pupils attending the school coming from out-with the catchment area utilise private transport. Currently, other pupils who live within the school catchment area are provided with transport in the form of two buses.

Further Information

Although it received a Government Grant, the school was very much an ecclesiastical one and was inspected regularly by the Presbytery. The history of the school is extremely well documented in the four school Log Books, the first of these dates from April 17th, 1880. In 1876, the school moved to its present site.

The school has a plaque situated at the front door, which is dedicated to John Law Hume, violinist and Tom Mullin, steward two former pupils who tragically died on the Titanic on the 15th April 1912.



Although Sheuchan School has been present in Stranraer for over a hundred years the present building was built in the early 1990's and was officially re-opened in 1994. Stranzaer Academy dates from 1845. In 1965, two schools were opened on the present site - Stranzaer Academy and Stranzaer High School. In 1970 the two schools were merged and in 1997 the first phase of a major rebuild was completed. A significant new extension to the first phase was completed in January 2010, which houses the dining and assembly facilities along with the class bases for many of the practical subject areas.





What Does It Cost?

We charge:

£1 per hour that the bus is away from its base, plus:

80p per mile for the first 100 miles

60p per mile thereafter


50p per mile (flat rate) for groups of children (Scouts, Youth Groups etc)
