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Our IDL topic this term is Scotland. We will go on walks in the local area to take pictures, create maps/models and compare Stranraer to other places in Scotland. Our information reports in writing will focus on describing and comparing Scottish animals, using all seven of our description bubbles. As well as reciting Scots poems, we will focus on Scots words and create a Scots dictionary.

In Literacy, we will begin to focus on more reciprocal reading strategies in group situations. Children will take turns to be the predictor, summariser, questioner, clarifier etc. We will continue to learn new spelling patterns using the Jolly Phonics programme.

In Numeracy, we will begin to look at addition and subtraction word problems. Afterwards, we will begin to have a stronger focus on multiplication. In Maths, we will look at the properties of 2D Shapes and 3D Objects as this was not fully covered due to term 2 being busy with our Christmas Show rehearsals.

READING-

As our topic is Scotland, we are going to be reading Sleekit Mr Tod, the Scots version of Roald Dahl's story Fantastic Mr Fox. We will be using Sleekit Mr Tod as our focus in Expressive Arts as we explore drama strategies, traditional Scottish music and Scottish artists.
