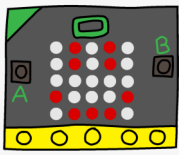

Something I learned last term was...

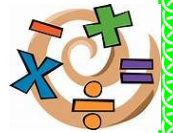
- Alli-'Mercury is the second hottest planet'.

Our Term 3 Focus

Making links between this and our technology focus, which will be micro:bits. On the topic of micro:bits, 'make code' is a great, free website for children to practise their coding if anyone is keen. 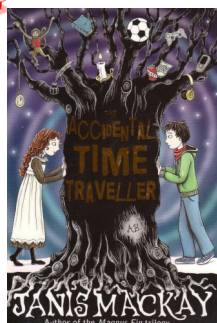


NUMERACY and MATHS- In terms of maths topics, we are looking to begin data and analysis, drawing links with our Scotland topic throughout. Shape/symmetry will be continued with Mrs Gratton on a Thurs. While working through strategies for addition and subtraction, we will also spend some time looking at multiplication and division. The class are big fans of the multiplication songs so I am sure these will be used regularly!



TOPIC -In line with the time of year, we are going to look at the topic of Scotland. Having a look at the environment around us and how we can look after it. We will also move onto a Viking mini-topic after Burns events.
