Almost 145,000 students across Scotland will receive their results on Tuesday 9 August 2022.

Once again, Skills Development Scotland's (SDS) Results Helpline will be there to offer information, advice and guidance to Scotland's young people and their parents and carers.

SDS results help is a key contribution to the Scottish Government's Young Person's Guarantee, supporting every 16 to 24-year-old in Scotland into a work or learning opportunity.

The SDS Results Helpline number is 0808 100 8000 – this goes live on results day, Tuesday 9 August and our advisers will have access to information on course vacancies at UK colleges and universities, Confirmation and Clearing, advice about Foundation, Modern and Graduate Apprenticeships and jobs, volunteering, training or staying on at school.

There's lots of support on Scotland's career website, My World of Work, including specific information for school leavers, and their parents and carers. Support is also available through our network of SDS centres that are open all across the country in every local authority in Scotland for young people, parents and carers to go to without any appointment required.

Young people and their parents and carers may need help to understand their choices. We'd like to ask all partners with a shared interest in supporting Scotland's learners to help spread the word about the range of SDS support available thoughout the year, and when results are delivered on 9 August.
